**A LITTLE EASTER BUNNY
TRADITIONS**

By tradition, it was obligatory (or at least lucky) for churchgoers to wear some bright new piece of clothing - at least an Easter bonnet, if not a complete new outfit.

The date of Passover is variable as it is dependent on the phases of the moon, and thus Easter is also a movable feast.

The traditional act of painting eggs is called Pysanka.

The egg has always been a symbol of the Resurrection to Christians.

Some Churches still keep up the old tradition of using evergreens - symbolic of eternal life - embroidered in red on white, or woven in straw, but most now prefer displays of flowers in the spring colors of green, yellow and white.

GENERAL MEETING JANUARY 8, 2008

The meeting was called to order by President, Dave Paul, at 7:05 at the Epworth Methodist Church. Board members present were Dave Paul, Carol Overfield, Jeff Murray, Dave Kienzie, Dick Buttermore, Bob Hinebaugh, Patrick Alkire, Lyn Denney, Carol Pense, Barry Griffith, and George Schmidt.

The minutes from our last meeting were approved.

The floor was open to nominations for 2008 officers. Dick Buttermore mad a motion to accept the nominations. It was seconded by George Schmidt and approved by all. The officers were sworn in by former Municipal Court Judge Mark Froelich. Everyone was introduced.

Presidents Report: Everyone's biggest concern is crime. A 161 task force was formed in 2006. We have a SID for 161. A Northland Business block watch is in the process.

Security: Dave Kienzie reported that crime was down a little in 2007 from 2006. 60% of membership money goes to security to have police officers patrol the area.

Membership: Dave Paul reported that 965 residents, 33.6%, joined the association this year. We collected \$19315 which is about 4% more that last year.

NCC: Reported by Lyn Denney. NCC is taking an aggressive stand against the strip clubs in the area. Nominations were made for this year's officers. Dave Paul was nominated President again. The NCC banquet will be February 22 at Monaco's Palace.

Civic Action: There was a problem with a resident running a car repair shop in his driveway. This has been reported to code enforcement.

NCC Development: Jeff Murray stated that NY Hookup on Cleveland Ave. is doing business in an area zoned for offices.

The Forest Park block watch has 115 members.

Some resident concerns: Parking on the grass by the park. AT&T equipment boxes on Blue Ash Rd.

We would like to set up goals for 2008. Each board member should bring an idea to the next meeting.

There was a motion made to have area reps get section reps information by the end of May so that they can start the process of door to door earlier.

Carol Overfield made a motion to let George Schmidt make the signs for the island in exchange for advertising in the Forester. It was seconded by Lyn Denney and approved by all.

FERAL CATS

Bob Barker always closed the "Price is Right" with the message to spay or neuter our pets. Drew Carey continues that message. Unfortunately, some of our neighborhood cat owners either don't watch the "Price is Right" or choose to ignore the advice. Cats are abandoned when people move or are "dumped" into our Salem area without regard to their welfare. According to the Best Friends web site, 17 million Americans feed stray/feral cats on a daily basis. We also offer shelter to these abandoned cats.

A feral cat is defined as one who has reverted to some degree to a wild state. They originate from domestic cats who are lost or abandoned and who learn to live outdoors in environments involving little human contact. Most cats are not completely wild because they still depend on people for their food to survive. Relatively few feral cats survive only by hunting. The degree of "wildness" depends on four factors: age of cat, generation of feral cat, extent of daily human contact, and cat's personality. If a cat is truly feral, the most compassionate choice is to allow them to remain in the environment (www.feralcats.com).

Feral cats plague sections of our Salem area. It is small consolation that these cats are a nationwide problem. A Google search found 10 web sites addressing the issue. Each one advocates the concept of Trap-Neuter-Release (TNR). TNR respects the cat's wild state and prevents suffering. Trapping and removing the cat is not effective on an on-going basis--survivors proliferate, and new cats move into the area (Rose Ballangee, Cat Welfare).

The cats cause numerous problems. A brochure available from Alley Cats (25 for \$5.00), "How to Live with Cats in Your Neighborhood," offers advice for dealing with strays. First, talk with neighbors to determine ownership of the cat. Solutions for specific problems include the following. For digging in gardens, scatter fresh orange or lemon peels or spray the area with citrus-scented fragrance. Plant the herb Rue to deter digging. If cats are hiding under your porch, block the entrances. Cover trash cans tightly to discourage scattering of trash. Cover your car to avoid cat prints or scratches. The smell of cat urine can ruin a pleasant time sitting on the porch--spray the area with white vinegar. Cats lounging on porches or patios--apply cat repellent liberally. Examples are ScareCrow and Cat Scat. One concern is the threat of rabies. According to the CDC (Center for Disease Control), 36 human cases of rabies deaths were reported from 1990-2002. None of these were acquired from feral cats. If the cat is truly feral (without owner/wild), the liability for cat bites relies on the laws of the city or county (Animal Control: 614-642-3400).

In Franklin County, there are no laws that prohibit free-roaming cats except in selected municipalities. The Capital Area Humane Society was euthanizing 44 cats a day during the summer (Rose Ballangee). Colony Cat Rescue works in conjunction with Franklin County Dog Shelter. The cats are from managed feral colonies in central Ohio. They attempt to find homes for cats that are too friendly, injured, or too young to be placed back in the wild (Rose Ballangee). Cat Welfare accepts cats on a space-available basis. Finding a veterinarian who is willing to spay/neuter below the usual/customary charge is not easy. To find a vet in our area, try SPAY/USA at 1-800-248-SPAY. Or contact Cat Welfare for the name of a local veterinarian. The spay/neuter procedure is done at the Good Samaritan's expense.

There are no straightforward answers to our neighborhood problem. Most of us want to do the "right thing" for these unwanted animals. We do feed them, we do offer them shelter from bad weather. We wish they would return the favor by not digging; spraying and scratching! Perhaps the answer is to partner with a rescue group in our area (Rose Ballangee). Another option, suggested by Best Friends, is to become more "political" and use the clout of our growing neighborhood association to find a solution.

The Forest Park Baseball Program is open to all children between the ages of 5 and 15, with Ranger traveling teams available for ages 10 through 14. 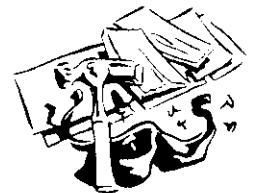
