HOME VALUES ARE SECURE By Joe Testa

Home values are secure in Franklin County. I feel the need to write this because the national news about the real estate market has been so overwhelmingly negative lately. While there are certainly more foreclosures here than we have seen, overall home values are still appreciating -- more slowly than in the past, but they are still appreciating.

The valuation process is largely dependent upon "arms length sales," which means normal transactions between willing buyers and sellers. A distressed sale, such as a foreclosure, is not a true indication of the market since the owner is not entering the sale willingly. Appraisal standards prevent the use of such sales as comparable sales.

In areas where there are several foreclosures, however, the value of the other properties might be adversely affected, but that would show up in the other regular sales. We review the regular sales to set the overall market values and then individually review any foreclosure which need consideration separate and apart from the general market.

One issue that might seem to support the perception that things are bad is the comparison of our real estate market to the recent past. We have enjoyed a strong appreciating real estate market in Franklin County for many years. County auditors are required to reflect that market and adjust our values accordingly every three years.

For 2005, our last update, we saw an annual average residential countywide rate of appreciation of 6.26 percent. That meant that not only were homeowners investments secure, they were building equity rapidly and could expect to see a healthy profit from a sale.

While still preliminary at this point, the next three-year period (which ended in December 2007) reveals averages in the 1 percent to 1 1/2 percent range per year. Certainly not the great growth in equity we used to see, but it is not in decline. Values almost exclusively are not dropping here as is reported elsewhere. Normal sales are still coming in at a little higher than the previously appraised values. We do see indications that there may be a very few small pockets to the contrary, but not remotely enough to affect the countywide market.

What it means is that your investment is still as secure as ever. If you put your home on the market now you can likely expect to take longer to sell and you probably can't realistically expect to tack on 6-7 percent per year on the selling price as the average homeowner could previously.

Some publications have recognized the stability of our market. "Forbes Magazine" is recently ranked us the third most stable housing market in the U.S. They looked at the local economy, affordability and inventory as well as new construction and foreclosures in their analysis.

Additionally, "PM Mortgage Insurance's Market Risk Index" ranked us among the least risky area to see home prices decline in the U.S. These analyses make sense because we know intuitively that real estate is location specific.

We are developing more features on our Web site to help you more easily track the actual sales in your neighborhood and easily compare how well they are holding value.

They will be released throughout the year as well as the "tentative value" mailer for the 2008 update later this summer.

I am concerned that some people, frightened over the bad news they receive daily, might sell themselves short on their equity and unknowingly give away some of the hard-earned profit that they are entitled to receive. They purchased their home, properly maintained it and improved it over the years. For most of us, that is our most significant financial asset. Be proud of what you have accomplished and know that even in the face of all the bad national news, the residential market in Franklin County remains strong.

JoAnn Jeck congratulated Dave Kienzel for his talk at the For-Mel Women's club.


Dick Graham, our City Liason Officer attended out meeting. Call 311 or go to 311.columbus.gov. for problems. His phone number is 645-7371.






There were no injuries reported.

NOTES FROM NORTHLAND By Cecilia Marrone

Spring is just around the corner and Spring break will be here before you know it! A large contingent of our amazing band will be boarding buses and heading south to Disney World for Spring Break accompanied by our director Mr. Rick Eckler and our esteemed principal Mr. Duane Bland as well as a multitude of other adult chaperones. Have you ever heard of the Four Chaplains Memorial Foundation? It is an organization created to honor the four chaplains of the U.S. Army Transport Dorchester on its way to Greenland during WWII in February 1943. German submarines torpedoed the sheep. As the ship went down, survivors told their accounts of the four chaplains (a Methodist Minister, a Catholic Priest, a Rabbi and a Dutch Reformed Church Minister) sacrificing their own life jackets and subsequently their own lives to save the lives of the men on board. They were last seen and heard standing arm in arm praying for the lives of everyone on board and in the water as the ship sank. What does this have to do with NHS? Well, on February 3rd, the 65th anniversary of that fateful day, our Symphonic Band performed in a tribute to the Four Chaplains at the United Methodist Church on Karl Road. They performed several pieces beautifully, but none so moving as their performance of "The Light Eternal" composed by James Swearingen. Mr. Swearingen was in attendance and was moved to tears during the performance which included a hunting flute solo by Andrew Simon commemorating the moment the ship sank. The emotion in the packed sanctuary and entry hall was palpable. Mr. Swearingen was then presented with a certificate of appreciation from the Four Chaplains Memorial Foundation.

In other NHS news, our school, your neighborhood high school was recognized by the U.S. News and World Report Magazine in December as one of the best High Schools in the nation and received a Bronze Medal! We are also recipients of State Recognition as a School of Promise for the third year running. Our students are working hard to prepare for the Ohio Graduation Tests that the 10th graders will sit for in March as well as the ACTs and the SATs for our uniors and seniors. We wish them all luck and know they will continue the upward trend in our rankings.

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
