FOREST PARK BLOCK WATCH PROGRAM

Sometimes I wonder if we are too involved in our own lifestyles to have enough time for even the simplest of things that make us a part of a community. We all have pressures of making a living, family obligations, and self-preservation that take up much of our waking hours. Add the economy, politics and society in general and we seem to be forced to withdraw into our own cocoons, either external or internal, in order for us to maintain some sanity in our lives. However, we are but a small part of the larger picture of humanity and still have a need to maintain a peaceful community in which all of us can live. Knowing your neighbors by talking to them concerning things they have seen or heard about unusual activities in our neighborhoods helps. It also means keeping track of what is going on around our 'cocoon' at all times. Several items have come to my attention that demonstrate my point. I bring these to you to illustrate, not to condemn any one or any area.

On Wednesday July 23, 2008 at about 9:30 PM the temperature was 70° with the humidity at 59% and was still twilight. A perfect time for an evening stroll on Satinwood near Ironwood in Forest Park West. A 60-year-old man who resides nearby thought so too. He has a heart condition and needs exercise. Two young men on bicycles approached but the man thought little of it until they stopped their bikes next to him. One of the kids pulled out a handgun and demanded the man's wallet. The man responded that he had no wallet on him but the punk saw that the man had a small book bag and grabbed it off the man's shoulder. The punk then struck the man in the jaw, jumped on his bicycle and rode off with his partner in crime. Fortunately, the man was not seriously injured and the punk's prize was the book bag and a small amount of heart medication, useless to the punks since they have no hearts.

My question is why didn't someone see or hear anything. Were these punks a part of the recently formed group known as the <u>Arborhood Gang</u> and was this 'hit' a part of an initiation process? If it was it needs to be stopped as soon as possible. Has anyone else heard of this new gang threat? An alert system to spread the word around the neighborhood may have kept this from occurring or at least caused someone to get a description of the punks. Should walking with someone not be an option, buy a whistle to carry along. Make some noise so someone can hear you.

If you see something or hear something, say something to someone. If you suspect gang activity in your neighborhood CALL THE POLICE or at least let me know. We do not need have these miscreants think that we are easy targets. If you call the Police there is no need to wait for an officer to make a formal report. Intelligence information would be a low priority incident if the perpetrators are long gone. You usually can remain anonymous. A record of your call makes the Police Department aware of these kinds of groups so the police can gather the Intel and possibly tie them to a particular crime. The same goes for graffiti that serves as gang territory markings and helps identify the gang. The man involved in this incident did make a report and the matter, undoubtedly, has been referred to the gang unit or at least to the robbery division. Since we all are not connected to the Internet, those of us who are need to speak for the neighbors who are not. See something - Say something.

I spoke with Earl Miller last week, and he suggested that I might provide some information about the Columbia Gas Riser Safety Program work in the Forest Park area over the next several weeks. Customers whose

risers are being replaced will receive a letter a few weeks in advance and a tag on their door a few days before the work is to be done.

Customers do not need to make arrangements in advance. However, once the replacement is complete, Columbia Gas will need to go inside to test and inspect gas piping and gas appliances before your service can be restored. Technicians will visit customers who are at home, and those who are not will receive a door ag with a phone number they can call to have service restored.

Forest Park will be one of the first communities in the state to have all Riser Safety Program work completed!

Notification of this slashing incident was reported by a resident to our Block Watch Captain recently.


This information is being passed on to dem-

onstrate how we can assist the Police Department and keep other members apprised of what is going in. Whether these guys were the 'slashers' we may never know but I guarantee these creeps will think twice before attacking this neighborhood again. If you see something, say something.

The following was reported: "Be advised that on Monday, August 4 at approximately 1:30 to 3:00 A.M., I witnessed two young (teens to early 20's, tall, African, males up to no good on Vinewood near Redwood Road, When they saw me coming towards them they took off running south on Redwood. At that time I called the CPD and 4 cruisers responded to the area within 10 minutes and searched for them. I do not think they ever found them, but that is just a hunch on my part. CPD should have a record of my call to the radio room and the results of the search by the arriving units.

At the time of my call to CPD, I reported that I suspected that they were trying to break into cars on Vinewood and Redwood, but obviously they were actually the tire slashers you reported in your email.

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



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[From the Franklin County Auditor]

Dear Property Owner:

The tentative results for the 2008 triennial update of values are now available on line. You will also be receiving a mailer stating your tentative value.

Overall, residential sales over the last three years are nearly equal to the 2005 values. I therefore have determined that a zero increase in residential value is required at this time. Unless you have improved your property (i.e. additions) or voters approve new levies, the tax impact of this year's update will mean a zero tax increase for homeowners for the next three years.

You may want to visit our website to review the sales in your area which occurred during the past 3 years. Just click on the Sales Activity link on the left hand side. The sales which have taken place may or may not be comparable to your property but may be useful information.

Agricultural, Commercial and Industrial property sales have continued to reflect a modest rate of appreciation over the same period. The impact of this update will mean that those owners may see a tax increase.

Agricultural and residential owners are invited to attend an "informal review" session at a location listed on the webpage and on your mailer. You can call our office at (614) 462-4663 (HOME) to schedule an appointment or walkin during the scheduled hours. If you have four or more residential investment properties, or own commercial or industrial properties please call (614) 462-7370 or (614) 462-6261 for an appointment with an appraiser at the Franklin County Courthouse, 373 S. High St. 20th fl, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

Your input is important to completing the triennial update process. The results of the review will be mailed to you prior to the December tax bills.
