Northland Community Council Banquet Forest Park Presidential Award Winners By George Schmidt

On Friday, March 6, 2009, Northland Community Council held its annual awards banquet. FPCA President, George Schmidt recognized Bob Hinebaugh, Arline Ries, and Bea White with the Presidential Awards for Forest Park.

In 1964 Bob and Mary Ann Hinebaugh became the first membership chairs of The FPCA. Bob has systematically volunteered for every project that has come down the pike. A few weeks ago Bob had by-pass surgery. He was heard saying that this was a good time of the year for heart surgery. He can be all healed in time to plant his landscape box on 161, for which he has received accolades. Bob has had very successful run as Area Representative in area 2. Year in and year out this area has had the highest or near highest percentage of homeowners joining the association.

In 1969 a young cub reporter joined the Forester team. Within years Arline Ries was editor in chief. I mean the chief. She sold all the advertising, did all the billings and collections so as to keep the Forester self sustaining. She ran the paper off on an old mimeograph machine in her basement. She delivered them. She laid out the copy on her bed. Arline was responsible for the distribution of around a million Foresters in 40 years. Arline has retired from the Forester. As if this was not enough to recognize her as the best of Forest Park, she has also held almost every office in the Civic Association. She is Forest Park!

Beatrice White was the rookie in our selections this year. This was her first year on the board. As a representative for the first time in area 10 she went above the call of duty. Having a difficult time recruiting section representatives she visited every single home (over 240) herself. Bea is a perfect example of the new volunteer in the association that is needed. She is a great example for us all. She is a woman of few words at our meetings, but when she speaks we do well to listen.

We had a wonderful time at the banquet. We are honored to have Bob, Arline and Bea in Forest Park.

The minutes from our last meeting were approved.

Glen West of Precision Car Wash on Tamarack Circle informed us of an offer he was given by T-Mobile to erect a cell tower on a fenced 50 sq. foot lot behind his business. It will be one pole 135' tall. He and representatives from T-Mobile will be at our general meeting in April.

The businesses on Tamarack Circle have been meeting to talk about some of the problems with kids, littering, and crime on the Circle.

George Schmidt will be meeting with Columbus School Superintendent Dr. Gene Harris on Thursday to discuss the schools in our area.

There was a discussion about yard waste not being picked up any more. Carol Pence suggested getting a dumpster for one day a month for people to put their yard waste in.

Dave Kienzel gave a report on security. The boy who shot a nerf gun at Northland High School was suspended. There has been an ongoing problem with someone breaking into houses. There will be a Block Watch meeting on March 17.

Dick Buttermore reported we will do the bulk mail out for membership on April 20th. . Section reps are needed.

Susan Buttermore gave a report on the Forester. Northland News is no longer delivering papers East of Tamarack Blvd. We will have Dispatch Consumer Services deliver the Forester. It will be delivered the first Sunday of the month. It was suggested that it be e-mailed to those we have addresses for.

Dave Paul gave the NCC report. Arline Ries, Bob Hinebaugh, and Bea White were the honorees for Forest Park at the NCC banquet. The planning of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade is in progress. George Hadler of Columbus Square has donated \$2500 for this event. Work is still going on at Northland Village. The animal shelter will begin building in 1-2 months. Menards is still on hold. There will be a cleanup on 161 on March 28.

#### PRESIDENT'S CORNER

#### Forest Park is a Model Community

In 1961, Forest Park West was the first residential neighborhood in Columbus, and among the first in the nation to incorporate internal shopping and recreation making it self-sufficient. The development of Forest Park East followed in 1965. Forest Park was a model for communities around the nation.

Years later, representatives from Forest Park were instrumental in developing The Northland Plan. This comprehensive plan was designed to assure healthy deliberate residential and business growth on the north end of Columbus. This document has been copied by scores of communities around the nation.

Now we are faced with new challenges and not just the current challenges of the recent recession. As I look at cities as well as our own I see a pattern. Nice new houses are built near the core of the city. People maintain these homes exquisitely. As decades go by new homes and new communities are developed farther from the core. People move out. The old neighborhood becomes worn and even poor. Just take a ride from the center of town in any direction and you will see neighborhoods with houses very similar to Forest Park but in great disrepair.

Forest Park is a model community. We are and will be the exception. Our commitment to the community and the will to work hard to make a difference shall prevail. We have a solid foundation of veteran volunteers who know how to get things down. We have young enthusiastic folks willing to join in our continued drive for excellence.

A few years ago I had a neighbor move in next door. The previous owners had the property looking like "Better Homes and Gardens." It does not take long before neglect will reveal itself in a house. In speaking to the young man I discovered he lived in a tenement house his whole life and never lived in a single family house. He did not know how to take care of the house. He did not have a lawn mower, weed whacker, fertilizer spreader, paint brush, ladder, etc. He had a hammer and a screwdriver. That was it. Worse, if he did have the tools, he had no idea how to use them.

Systematically he learned how to take care of his property and gradually became the proud owner of tools. The property never reached the level of "Better Homes and Gardens", but looked liked the rest of the neighborhood. His mother came to town and was impressed. She planted lots of flowers. We discovered that as a little girl she grew up on a farm. Her parents were share croppers. They had great pride in their gardens. The depression forced the family into the city and tenement housing. What a joy to watch her plant and be reminded of her youthful days. What fulfillment to watch her son take pride in taking care of his property. Mom came back every spring for planting season. Our neighbor just needed a little encouragement.

This is one example of how we can help buck the tide and keep our neighborhood strong and beautiful. I say let us not give in to the negative forces that attack us. Let us stay strong. Let us help each other to do better.

I plan to suggest to the Northland Community Council that we appoint a group to develop a detailed plan on how to keep our area vital. This plan can include ways to lobby our city, to train people on how to take care of property, how to look after each other, standards for the neighborhoods, etc. We had a plan to develop the community and a plan to help it grow. Now we need a transition plan.

Forest Park has always been a model community. There is every reason we can continue to be a model community, buck the trend and remain special.

#### PRO BOWLERS ASSOCIATION IN TOWN

It's not every day that a resident sees ESPN trailers making national telecasts inside his neighborhood. Yet for Forest Park residents, the sight is not uncommon any more.

For the second straight year, the PBA made a tour stop at the Sequoia Pro Bowl. The week was filled with events leading up to the March 8 televised final of the "Don Johnson Buckeye State Eliminator" tournament. "Its part of the thrill," remarked Sequoia owner Tim Voss as he thought about the national exposure. "It can also be nerve-racking, making sure that everything goes off perfect." Thus far it appears it has. The success of Sequoia's 2008 event is what ensured its return. Last year, a full capacity crowd illustrated the support for the event. If the attendance continues to remain strong, it will be hard for PBA organizers to turn down further invitations. The Eliminator was significant enough to have a regional and national draw. As expected, many local bowlers from Ohio were present. Bowlers represented several other states, including Colorado, and Florida. The field even crossed national borders by having participants from Ontario, Canada and San Pedro, Mexico. The week's festivities drew amateurs and countless spectators along with the professionals.

"This is an experience they'll never forget," Renee Clink said, referring to her children. All three were in attendance at the March 4 Pro-Am tournament seeking autographs. Husband Robert was bowling side by side with tour members as Renee and many spectators witnessed from densely populated bleachers. A family of avid bowlers, the Clink's came south from Zanesfield, Ohio for the evening. The children proudly showed autographs from PBA stars with plans to later have it framed. "We've made some progress," said 12 year old Jordyn as he proudly held two pages completely full.

Under the Pro-Am structure, PBA bowlers played five frames with a party before moving to another group. During the transition, they signed autographs and posed for pictures. The week-long event was designed not only to entertain, but to further invigorate the sport. Sequoia has plans to be involved in that movement. "We're just not for the casual bowler," said Voss. "We also want to be the future of the game." Voss said the PBA tour has led to an increase in business, particularly with leagues.

Mayor Michael Coleman also found his way to Sequoia for bowling's equivalent of the opening ceremonies. While last year, his ceremonial first roll found its way in the gutter, Coleman changed strategies by first rubbing the championship trophy for good luck. As luck would have it, Coleman delivered a strike. Voss and his staff are expecting many high profile strikes in their future as well.
