Dick was FPCA president in 1997 and 1998 and again in 2008. He was our "Civic Action Officer" for a decade. I think most people know him best for his organizing and managing the Bikes and Trikes entry into the Fourth of July Parade. He delighted in giving out those medallions to hundreds of children.

Dick had a passion for membership. He was the consummate recruiter for membership, board members, business members, you name it! He served on every budget and nomination committee as long as I have been around. I do not know who I can send this note to for editing. Dick was the resident editor of everything that Forest Park produced.

Dick many times mentioned that he was recruited to participate in FPCA by his neighbor Alf Hansen, who was FPCA president in 1982. Dick's service to the community can be said to begin shortly after they purchased their home in 1986. I am amazed at how many people mentioned to me the honest and professional work Dick did for them as the neighborhood handyman.

This was posted on Dick's Facebook. I thought it was perfect.

This is my final farewell to all of the beautiful people I have been fortunate to meet in my life. Thank you for the friendships throughout the years. Remember, one at a time on the trampoline! I considered myself pantheist, "God is everything and everything is God ... the world is either identical with God or in some way a self-expression of its nature." If you want to commemorate me, damnit - use proper English!!!!

He was a true, honest friend. Dick was one the few people I knew who loved a good debate and always argued fairly, never taken it to the personal level. I will miss Dick Buttermore. Whether you knew him or not if you live in Forest Park you will miss him too.

I plan on taking some time with this and would welcome suggestions. Forest Park ought to do something to remember Dick Buttermore. It would be great to hold him as an example of what can be achieved with hard work and integrity.



FOREST PARK CIVIC ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING NOVEMBER 9, 2010 By Carol Overfield

The meeting was called to order by Vice President Dave Paul, at 7:00 at the Epworth Methodist Church. Board members present were Dave Paul, Carol Overfield, Dan Hartzell, Dave Kienzle, Susan Buttermore, Mary Squerra, Lyn Denney, Bob Hinebaugh, and Carol Pence.

Mary Squerra made a motion to accept the minutes from our last meeting. It was seconded by Lyn Denney and approved.

The Treasurer's report was given by Dan Hartzell. The budget for 2011 was presented. It was approved by all. An audit needs to be done. Carol Overfield, Lyn Denney, Susan Buttermore, and Dave Paul will do this early next year. It was suggested that something be given to Jonathan Allen for his work on the islands.

There was a discussion about getting a Columbus Foundation grant for beautification. This would be a major undertaking. We should look into a smaller grant next year.

Dave Kienzle gave a report on security. On November 1 we switched to US Protection to patrol our streets. There has been a problem of heroin trafficking in our area. These are mostly illegal aliens. They meet at a public place and then drive to a guiet neighborhood to make the exchange.

Jean Bower has been working with Kit Race to plant flowers on the islands. She has 90 tulip bulbs she wants to plant on November 20 at 10:00. She needs volunteers to help her. They have bought 3 lilac bushes and a crabapple tree. Meijers donated \$100.00 which she will use to buy supplies. Bob Hinebaugh will buy solar lights to put on the islands.

Mike, from the library, thanked everyone for the levy support. They will go back to the normal hours and days starting in January.

We had 835 residences pay for membership this year. This is less than it has ever been.

There was a suggestion that a member of the block watch tie a ribbon around a tree in their front yard to let everyone know we're watching. The casino at the VFW on Sandalwood is still being investigated.

Our next meeting will be a Christmas dinner at George's house.







Since 2005, the Forest Park community has had an active community Block Watch, composed of residents working with each other, the Columbus Division of Police and the FPCA's Supplemental Security officers to help keep our homes and residents safe. With almost 3000 single-family households in Forest Park East and West, we need **your** help to keep our Block Watch organization growing and serving our community.

What is a Block Watch?

- √ A Mindset
- ... Being prepared to look out for the safety and security of your neighbors and your community as well as yourself and your family.
- √ A Resource
- ... Information and ideas you can use to keep yourself, your family, your home and your community safe.
- ✓ A Network
- ... A means to share information quickly and easily with your neighbors and with local law enforcement to help detect criminal activity, identify criminals and prevent
- ✓ An Image
- ... Making criminals and others aware that our community pays attention to and cares about crime, and is prepared to do what it takes to prevent it.

What does it cost?

The <u>only</u> cost is your time and interest – there is no expense or membership fee to be part of the Block Watch. In terms of time, your commitment can be as little as an hour to 90 minutes each month to attend a Block Watch meeting, or as much time as you can offer to help manage, organize and share information with our neighbors about the Block Watch.

GIFTS FOR THE ISLANDS

In the November 2010 Forester, I wrote about the "Islands Project". The "Islands" are the two main entrances to Forester Park East and West located at the intersection of Karl Rd. and Sandalwood Pl. Jonathan Allen, volunteer landscaper, Kit Race, former Area 6 representative, and I are pleased to report that we are making progress in our quest to "spruce up" the areas.

Jonathan applied weed killer to the lawn on both sides and will be replacing the sad looking crab apple tree on the west side with one recently purchased at as reduced price. Along with the carpet flowers, Black-eyed Susans and Lilacs, obtained with a matching grant toward beautification from Columbus, we have found spring flowering bulbs of crocus, daffodils, and tulips at marked down prices. By watching the money spent, we are able to buy more quantity to produce a wide splash of color. And the nicest part about this season of giving is the effort and time donated by persons who showed up at the Islands on Saturday, November 20 with their bulb planters, kneeling pads and shovels to plant almost 100 bulbs. How delightful for next spring.

And for this holiday season we requested and received a generous donation from the Meijer store on Cleveland Ave., where many of us shop. The store director, Kevin Dicler was most gracious in approval of a gift card for purchases. The plan is to place 2 live green wreaths on each side of the stone markers identifying Forest Park and adorn them with outdoor velvet ribbon bows. Placing a wreath at each end of the stone markers will enhance the view from both the east /west and north/south directions. The decorations will be highlighted by the addition of solar spotlights approved for purchase at the November 9 Board meeting. Bob Hinebaugh, Area 2 Representative, made the initial suggestion for lighting the Islands at one of the 50th Anniversary Committee meetings. He took the lead in investigation of illumination of several kinds and found the solar spotlights may do the trick. So our decorations for the holidays will show up day and night as a greeting for our neighbors and community.

Many thanks to all of you who support our Civic Association with your contributions in time and dollars as will as the Meijer Store Director, Kevin Dicler and his associates, the diggers in the dirt planting bulbs and the energy expended by our Association Board.
