Dogs will not be left outside without being supervised. They are a dogs only facility and do not have pit bulls. They will have a meeting room that can be used by the public. Susan Smith, Community Relations Manager, was also present to take questions. Paula also talked about Franklin County Government. Franklin County has an excellent credit rating. The minutes from our last meeting were presented and approved. The Treasurer's report was presented and passed. Our next meeting will be at the NCC picnic at Blendon Woods on August 9 at 6:00. Everyone should bring a side dish or salad.

The biggest issue of the community was the convenience store at Forest Park Plaza. It looks very messy with too many signs in the windows. There is also a possible problem with selling alcohol to underage people.




