We enjoyed the coordinators meeting with Officer Clinger on April 21, 2009. Our meeting included a tour of the new Strategic Response building on Morse Rd. We also talked with a 9-1-1 dispatcher and have some tips to share with you.

When calling 9-1-1 stay calm. They are dispatching as they are talking to you. They will stay on the phone with you until help arrives, but talking to you is not slowing down the patrol car or ambulance.

If calling from your cell phone, your location is not recorded. Be sure to state your address clearly so they can send help to your location.

Finding out the start times to different Columbus activities is outside the scope of 9-1-1 dispatchers. Please check your news channel websites or newspapers for that information.

We have great dispatchers and operators here in Columbus. They want to help you and are trained to do so.

We also enjoyed our block watch meeting at Epworth United Methodist Church on April 28. A few highlights from this meeting:

Truancy patrol is working! This will continue through the school year and then the focus will switch to curfew enforcement.

A smaller group within the block watch will be meeting to discuss different marketing ideas and how to get organized so we all have the most up-to-date information. If you are interested in being on this team, please let me know. I believe food will be involved in all meetings.

We have a great block watch but can always use more involvement. Please join us Tuesday, June 23 at Epworth United Methodist Church at 7 PM for our next meeting. The more people we have the more we can accomplish.

The meeting was called to order by President George Schmidt at 7:00 at the Epworth Methodist Church. The roll call was taken. Board members present were George Schmidt, David Paul, Carol Overfield, Dick Buttermore, Mike Stone, Susan Buttermore, Lyn Denney, Jim Saling, Ernie Mack, Bob Hinebaugh, Kit Race, Cynthia Applin, Mary Sguerra, Carol Pence, and Bea White.

Dick Graham took questions about problems in the area. There is a house on Tamarack with trash and high grass. The park on Aqua needs to be mowed. There is tall grass at a house at Karl and Sandalwood. A resident on Cedar Willow is doing a carpet business out of the house.

The minutes from our last meeting were approved with one change.

The Treasurer's report was presented. It was approved. It was decided that an audit should be done.

There was a discussion about the increase in city tax being proposed. George will ask someone from City Council to attend our July meeting to answer any questions.

The National College has opened in the former Sears Hardware building at Columbus Square.

The theme for the 4th of July parade is Northland: Working, Sharing, Protecting. Volunteers are needed for the parade. George Hadler of Columbus Square has donated \$2500. Columbus Square Bowling Alley will sponsor a fundraiser on June 13 from 1:00 to 5:00. As of 5/18, his event has been cancelled.

Dave Paul gave a report on membership. We have collected \$7340 so far.

The report on the Forester was given by Susan Buttermore. It was decided to increase the rates for ads since it has been six years since the last increase and we are losing money each month.

The NCC report was given by Lyn Denney and Dave Paul. A shredding day and food drive for Mid-Ohio Foodbank will be June 6 from 10:00 to 2:00 at the YMCA. There was a **presentation by Franklin County Children's Services. The annual picnic will be August 11.**

National Night Out will be August 4. Several ideas were discussed for Forest Park residents to participate.

The NCC Development Committee report was presented by Jim Saling. An approval was given for a church at Cleveland and Edmonton. An approval was given for a sign setback for Walgreens at Cleveland and Morse. An apartment complex at Morse and Hamilton want to extend into the next lot. This was not endorsed. Meghan Strader is the new block watch co-coordinator.

There are a lot of residents needing help with various household tasks and we have volunteers willing to help. Carol Pence will come up with a plan to coordinate this project.

We were adjourned at 9:00.
