Where do I report Issues in the neighborhood?

As I write this, it is bitter cold outside and thoughts of spring are far away. But I know the seasons will soon turn (Punxsutawney Phil says so!), and before we know it, the new season will be here. Pothole season! We've already seen a few potholes after the recent thaw. But by the time you read this, they will be everywhere. And you can help fix them. The city has a great reporting system, called 311. You can either dial [\(614\) 645-3111](tel:6146453111) or go to the website 311.columbus.gov. On the 311 site, you can create a login id. That's useful, as report numbers will then be sent to your e-mail, and that number can be used to track your problem. For potholes, the city will usually repair them within three days (often faster), excepting when there is ice and snow. 311 is also a useful system to report other city concerns. For example, you have an old sofa to get rid of. What do you do? Contact 311 for a bulk item pickup. Abandoned car? 311. The tree by your house in the green space between sidewalk and curb has a broken branch? 311. Graffiti? 311. High grass? 311. And dozens of other items. You can even complain to the mayor there. While potholes are usually taken care of quickly, other issues may take a bit longer. That's where we come in. If you have such an issue and you have the 311 report number, let us know. We can forward it to our city liaison, and he will help oil the squeaky wheels. This is one way the Civic Association works for you. You do have to report the issue, as we need a report number to work with. We can help you after that. You can also come to any Civic Association meeting and discuss it there. We have time set aside at every monthly meeting for discussion of resident concerns and all meetings, with the exception of the December meeting are open to all residents.

A safety note. We would like to remind our residents that 25 mph is the speed limit in almost all of Forest Park. It is important to be careful with your speed to protect the children and other pedestrians in our neighborhood. This is especially true in the winter, when snow and ice can make driving a challenge. I have seen a car up on a large rock on Satinwood, because they took a curve too fast in icy conditions. If you notice speeding on your street, please notify our Supplemental Security officer, who will tell you how to report it. We also can request a speed trailer from the city during warm weather months to show how fast people are going. One will be appearing in Forest Park West in April. They are used to ascertain the need for additional speed controls such as signs and speed bumps. Submitted by Ken Gilbert, FPCA President

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FPCA meeting minutes, February 10, 2015

The Forest Park Civic Association meeting of February 10th, 2015 was called to order by President Ken Gilbert at Epworth United Methodist Church at 7:00 p.m. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The President talked about spring clean-up days being held in our area by the NCC and the city.

Roll call was taken.

Dan Hartzell read the treasurer's report for January. A motion to accept the report as read was put forward and passed.

Police liaison Scott Clinger answered questions from attendees about recent police action in our community.

City liaison Dick Graham answered questions about illegal parking of large trucks and the condition of streets. The city will be looking into correcting the flooding problem at Yellowwood and Sandalwood.

Guest speaker Bruce Robinson, RN, described his involvement with free medical, dental, and legal clinics offered by Xenos and Vineyard churches.

The President opened the floor for questions, none were received.

There was a short discussion of increasing our social media presence. This issue will be studied further.

Committee reports highlights:

P.J. Phillips, our new Business Committee Rep, introduced herself and put forth two motions, both of which passed. The first changes the business membership year from fiscal to calendar. The second gives paid-up business members a 5% discount off advertising fees.

Mary Sguerra is planning for the May garage sale. Probable date will be May 16th.

Rita Woeste is looking for ideas to distribute The Forester to area 13, as Eddie Jones can no longer provide this service. About 80 households are involved.

Ed Vanasdale reported that new welcome packets are being developed.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:06.

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Office of Franklin County Auditor allows homeowners to file a request to review property values.

Franklin County property owners who feel their property value is too high or too low may file a request to change their value with the Board of Revision, by the deadline Tuesday, March 31.

Residents have until Tuesday, March 31 at 5 p.m. to return their [Board of Revision application](#) in person. Applications can be emailed or faxed until 11:59 p.m. on March 31. Mailed applications must have a postmark no later than March 31.

Some Board of Revision complaints will go through the [mediation](#) process.

The basic idea for this program is to conduct the mediations by phone for the convenience of the complainant. It is our goal that your case will be resolved quicker than the standard Board of Revision process.

The complainant, a mediation representative from the Franklin County Auditor's Office and the mediator will typically be the individuals involved in the mediation. If the respective school board becomes involved in the mediation they will become another party.

In the event a property owner is successful in reducing their property value, a refund of any overpayment of taxes collected based on the higher value will be refunded or credited to their upcoming tax bill.

You....& others make FPCA Great!

Happy March!! Only two more months until the end of winter!! I offer the following hodge podge of thoughts for your enjoyment and consideration.

First I want to express my gratitude to CPD Officer Scott Klinger for his continued diligence in improving the Northland Community. He's had tremendous success in putting pressure on those businesses that have been harmful neighbors for us all. He spends a lot of time writing certified letters to property owners, and finding creative means to apply pressure to those businesses needing to do things right. At the February meeting, I asked Klinger what positive impact he has seen from the temporarily closure of several hotels. He replied that he has seen communications (word on the street) saying "it's too hot up north." Also he said that the hotel suspensions resulted in 800 less police runs resulting in more man hours being applied elsewhere.

In a similar way, I'm tipping my hat to Columbus Neighborhood Liaison Dick Graham. He will continue to serve in the role but his schedule will not allow him to be at our monthly FPCA meeting. Dick has done a fantastic job working for us here in Forest Park. Whenever we are pressing a case in through the city, Dick often speeds up the process by connecting us to the right people or personally pressing the matter internally. Does every case end up with a happy ending? Of course not, but thanks to Dick (with respect to the OSU marching band) "we'll win the game or know the reason why."

I wrote last November that "the thermometer stands at 57" referring to memberships we were hoping to get back to the previous year's membership total. I forgot to add an update, but we did not close this gap. At the same time, I appreciated the people who responded to the call and sent in new memberships to close out the year. We're about a month away from starting the 2015-16 membership campaign.

Areas 6, 7, and 8 still need area representatives to serve on the civic association board. All three areas are in Forest Park East, where such activity is critical. You will find that the people on the board are friendly and fun to be with. There's some time involve in serving, but it is not overwhelming. Serving will make you a better informed and likely more fulfilled FPCA resident. Please consider.
