What your FPCA President wants you to know.....

My fellow residents, I would like to use this opportunity to remind you all once again that our annual membership drive is now in full swing! In May, each household would have received a white, rectangular envelope in the mail from the Forest Park Civic Association. As I have alluded to all year so far, this envelope is the beginning of our annual membership drive. Civic association membership forms as well as the May edition of The Forester newsletter were included in the mailing.

As you all know, I have asked for your engagement, support, and commitment in making this a record year for the number of paid memberships in the civic association. I believe that we can surpass over 2100 paid memberships this year—so if you haven't yet mailed in your membership packet I implore you to do so at your earliest convenience. In addition to serving as the President of our civic association, I also serve a Treasurer for the Northland Community Council (NCC). For those of you who do not know about this organization, you can check them out at <https://www.columbusncc.org>.

The NCC describes itself as a “coalition of civic associations, home-owners associations, and other community groups in the Northland Area of Columbus, OH.” The NCC serves to advance the interests of its member organizations with the City of Columbus and other state and local entities. I think what it does best; among other things, is it lends the smaller communities in the Northland Area who aren't almost 3000 households strong (like Forest Park) a big voice. I am sad to report that many of the member organizations all talk about low levels of engagement from residents and an inability to collect enough membership dollars to even maintain a seat at the NCC. This year, 3 civic associations have lost their seat due to a combination of 2 reasons—they can't find anyone to attend the once-a-month meetings, and/or they don't have enough money in the organization to pay the annual membership fee. Fortunately, this isn't the plight of the Forest Park Civic Association; however, we can and must do better! We must not now or ever grow complacent. We cannot take it for granted that someone else will step up! I am asking you all to step up with me by making sure we have a banner membership drive in 2019.

Lastly, we have 2 vacancies in our civic association that we need help filling as soon as possible! Due to health reasons, Linda Whitmore and Linda Ridenour, who were nominated as our Volunteers of the Year 2018 and honored at the NCC Annual Volunteer Awards Banquet this month, for their work coordinating the assembly and delivery of our monthly newsletter are stepping down in November! I am asking that any person(s) who can take over for them to contact me ASAP! Linda and Lindy, have a manual put together for the person(s) who would take over from them and will continue to take calls to answers questions and offer guidance as needed. We cannot thank them enough for all they have done for us all! Additionally, Catherine Gilbert, who currently handles billing for the advertisers in the monthly newsletter is also stepping down after her many years of service to us! Please contact me if you can assist us in filling this position as well.

I wish you all a wonderful summer in which I hope to meet many of you at our Annual Picnic, the 4th of July Parade, and Gabby's Night! Be sure to check our events calendar on the website www.fpcivic.org for the dates and mark your calendars! Additionally, if you are on Facebook and haven't yet joined our residents-only Facebook Group, do ask to join—the name of the group is Forest park Community (Official).

Hello Forest Park! The sun is shining and I think it's safe to say that the warm weather is here to stay. As the school year comes to an end and people are planning their summer vacations, we wanted to remind you that with your paid Forest Park Civic Association membership, you can submit your request for supplemental security house checks by returning the form below. Please remember to return the form at least a week before your planned vacation so that the security company can plan their inspections accordingly. A vacation without the stress of what is going on back at home is just one of the benefits of your paid membership.

At this time of year, when the weather is nice and the days are long, it can be tempting to leave your personal belongings in your car and your car doors unlocked. While we live in a relatively safe community, the Columbus Police Department cautions us against it. There has been a recent increase of incidents of people checking car doors and taking what is inside when the car door is left opened. Locking your car is an easy deterrent of theft. It is also good to remember to take your garage door opener into the house with you to keep access into your home guarded. As always, if you see something, say something and be safe everyone.

Despite being registered, it is still possible to file reports anonymously.

If there are still pot holes near where you live, report them!! Also, if you see any hint of graffiti on public property such as streets or signs, again use 311 to report it.

*Do a little something to beautify the neighborhood. Keep your lawn consistently cut and reach out to help those around you who might be struggling to maintain theirs. Many times, there might be a circumstance for longer than expected grass.

* Mail in your FPCA membership ASAP. Doing so really helps shape what the association can and cannot do to support you.

* Further build relationships with your neighbors. We have the annual National Night Out Block Party in August, but you don't have to wait to then to hold a neighborhood gathering. The more you know your neighbors, the easier it is for you to collaborate.

* Take pride in the Forest Park neighborhood. Our location within Columbus can often lead suburban people to gain the wrong impression of the area. Some people I talk with think it is some type of war zone. While we certainly have some challenges that are not typically associated with the suburbs, we have a lot of charm, diversity, character, history and resources that are unique. And on a day to day basis this it is a beautiful, peaceful community with wonderful people. So let's tell our story before other people decide to tell it for us.
